Robert Dare (bap 24th January 1618 at Yarcombe, son of John)

Date will written 18-5-1667, ie written when Robert about 49yrs.

Described himself as yeoman of Yarcombe.

To poor of Yarcombe 6sh 8d.

To Prudence Dare (then aged 8yrs) my daughter, £30 at 21yrs and if she dies before that the money to be shared between my other three daughters.

To Johan Dare (then aged 6yrs) my daughter, £30

To Susanna Dare (then aged 4yrs) my daughter, £30

To Agnes (then aged 2yrs) my daughter, £30.

To Johan Astchin (?), my sister's daughter, 40sh to be paid at 21yrs.

To John Dare (45yrs) my brother, a bay colt.

To Prudence Dare (37yrs) my sister, stock

Certain goods to 4 daughters as named above

Residue to Agnes my wife and exec.

Witnesses Tristiam Hackham, George Knight, William Davey and John Dare.

Inventory taken on 4-6-1667 by George Knight, William Davey: Goods and stock £294

Will proved 26-3-1668.

It is unclear what happened to each of the daughters but by 1786 the property of Clifhayne was in name of John Willie. On Land Tax of 1798 the owner was still John Willie. 1810 Land Tax had George Glade as tenant. In 1810 the property was described as mid 17th century.

Clifhayne was refurbished in mid 19th century but still stands and retains 17th century crossbeams in the parlour and kitchen.
